FROM OUR PASTOR

Welcome to our New Ministers

January has been a great start for this year. Two new pastoral staff members were recently called to serve on our pastoral staff, and I want to introduce them to you. Please be in prayer for these new ministers as they and their families transition to our church.

On January 9th, your elders called the Rev. **Michael Brock** to be our Assistant Pastor. Michael and his wife Lisa are Marietta natives. Both graduated from Samford University (Birmingham), and Michael is a graduate of Birmingham Theological Seminary. Before entering the pastorate, Rev. Brock served with Campus Outreach and was a business man. He served as Asst. Pastor at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Montgomery, Alabama, under Rev. Claude McRoberts, our missions speaker last fall. In 2003, Rev. Brock accepted the call to the Redeemer Presbyterian Church, a new church plant, in Florence, Alabama. Thus, he brings a wide range of experience and a great love for outreach to our staff.

We are especially happy to welcome their five children: Ragan (17), Tabby (14), Priscilla (10), and twin sons Charles and Bryant (9).

Rev. Brock is to be examined and received by our Presbytery on Feb. 2, and he plans to begin his ministry here on March 2. His Installation Service is scheduled for March 9, following the 6:00 PM worship service.

Please pray for the sale of their home in Florence, preparation of their hearts for a new ministry, and give thanks to the Lord for leading the search committee to such a fine ministerial family.

Next on January 21st, the Session examined and called **Joel Smit**, who has two courses remaining at Greenville Presbyterian Theological Seminary in South Carolina. Mr. Smit is already licensed by Calvary Presbytery, has completed his internship at Woodruff Road PCA in Simpsonville, SC, and has only to sustain his ordination exams prior to completing his process toward ordination. He will serve as our Assistant Pastor for Youth and Families.

Originally from the cornfields of northwest Iowa, Joel is the son of a Christian Reformed Pastor, and he lived in Sioux Center (IO), Grand Rapids (MI), and Fresno (CA). He met his wife Stefanie at Simpson College in Redding, California. After graduation and marriage, Joel and Stefanie moved to Greenville, where he has taken his seminary classes, worked with youth groups at Downtown Presbyterian and Woodruff Road Presbyterian, and worked for the Department of Homeland Security as a baggage screener at the Greenville airport.

Joel and Stefanie bring a love for youth and their parents to Midway, and their 3 month old son, Peter. Please pray for them to complete their work and studies in Greenville and prepare to relocate here. Joel will begin his work on some weekends this spring.

We thank God for leading us to these extraordinarily gifted servants. Pray for your elders also as they seek a leader for Children's Ministry.

In God's order of creation, following light, air, water and land, the first living things created were plants. All other creatures depend on plants no matter where they are on the food chain. I love that God so logically put our world together. Back to plants, on the third day, Genesis 1:11, "Then God said, 'Let the land produce vegetation: seed-bearing plants and trees on the land that bear fruit with seed in it, according to their various kinds.'" Just in case you have never

planted seeds I can tell you that is a very reassuring fact. For if I sow lettuce or bean seeds I want lettuce and beans plants not turnips or pumpkins.

The Bible is full of gardening illustrations, as it was an agrarian culture. Some of the richness of the comparisons may be lost on our technological society. At the end of his explanation to his disciples on the parable of the soils, Jesus said, "Others, like seed sown on good soil, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop – thirty, sixty or even a hundred times what was sown." Each seed doesn't reproduce only itself but multiples of its self, so that it yields seed for the sower (next year's crop) and bread for the eater (food for this year).

In many ways a church is like a garden. We at Midway are fed regularly from God's word. We are in turn to share it with others. And we are. A percentage of our tithes and offerings help support 45 different missionary families who are sowing the seed of the gospel around the world. A second way we help our missionaries is by collecting money that is designated over and above the tithe for projects. In 2007, \$21,530 was given and sent out to help fund projects. Two projects were mercy ministries for Katrina relief, Lagniappe Presbyterian Church in Bay St. Louis and Desire Street Ministries in New Orleans, LA. We had work teams go and minister in both these areas. Two projects were overseas and tied to Midway missionaries. First was funding for a ministry center in Bangkok for the MTW church planting team in Thailand. We should hear a report on the second one from David Cunningham the end of March. The church plant that he started in Australia has a missionary outreach of its own into Bangladesh. The funds Midway sent were to help with the physical needs of the church in Bangladesh.

From the field: please continue to pray for the political unrest in Kenya following the recent elections. Midway supports both, Bob and Patty Meredith, NAV, and Steve and Kathy Womack, WBT, working in Nairobi. They have been sending regular updates. Bob writes, "Many staff we know are working hard at PEACEMAKING. They express a desire for prayers for PEACE, not CALM. Peace is based on Justice. They desire to see that, also. "Calm" can be experienced without dealing with real issues, without justice and without depth of relationship."

From the Music Director . . .

RZIM Ministries (Ravi Zacharius) maintains a website called A Slice of Infinity. Jill Carattini, a regular contributing author for this on-line devotional site, wrote an article entitled "A Weighted Doxology", which gives the inspirational background for the hymn "Now Thank We All Our God". The following is extracted from her January 18, 2008 article.

"Amid the darkness of the Thirty Years' War, German pastor Martin Rinkart is said to have buried nearly five thousand fellow citizens and parishioners in one year, including his young wife. Conducting as many as 50 funerals a day, Rinkart's church was ravaged by war and plague, famine and economic disaster. Yet in the midst of that dark year, he sat down with his children and wrote the following lines as a prayer for the dinner table:

Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices;
Who wondrous things hath done, in Whom this world rejoices.
Who, from our mother's arms, hath led us on our way
With countless gifts of love and still is ours today.

O may this bounteous God, through all our life be near us,
With ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us;
And keep us still in grace, and guide us when perplexed;
And free us from all ills, in this world and the next.

"Martin Rinkart's simple table grace was later made into a powerful hymn and sung at a celebration service at the war's end. Adding a third stanza, Rinkart's words continue with thanksgiving, concluding fittingly with words of doxology, words proclaiming the eternal weight of our glorious God."

All praise and thanks to God the Father now be given;
The Son and Him Who reigns with Them in highest heaven;
The one eternal God, Whom earth and heaven adore;
For thus it was, is now, and shall be evermore.

May we, too, in the midst of life's trials, be compelled to sing these words of praise.
