FROM OUR PASTOR

Progress This Month

As your new staff is settling in, some great things are coming together. In May, we saw the following:

- The installation service for Pastor Marc Harrington, whose ministry planned the following events: a Prince Caspian day with over 100 attending, both Father-Son outings and a Mother-Daughter Tea, and held an informative Parents meeting to announce a full summer of plans. Music Camp (June 23-27) has received a higher than expected registration, VBS is planned (July 21-25), and many weekly activities are on tap.
- Pastor Joel Smit completed his seminary work and relocated here with his family. He hosted a successful parents' meeting on May 18 and honored the graduating high school seniors on May 11. Retreats for middle and high schoolers are planned, and our youth work is off and running for the summer. Be sure to have your youth involved if at all possible.
- Pastor Michael Brock led much of our recent Elders' Retreat this year and discussed plans for outreach, assimilation, and shepherding. He began the new Inquirers Class on June 1 (in the Choir Room) and is planning to teach the Wednesday night adult bible study, beginning June 18 @ 7:00 PM.

We have a full and exciting summer ahead of us as a church. I invite you to use your summer months to the max for these and other opportunities for Christian growth.

Also, as we thank the Lord, after a full year of construction, let's join and thank God for the following, including some things that have NOT occurred:

- A very fine safety record with no major injuries to construction workers;
- Midway School completed its year and the children have been kept safe;
- Even though muddy for a while, worship services have not been disrupted, as some churches must do during construction like this;
- The building project has not received major time setbacks;
- Major ministries continue during the construction;
- Financial support of missionaries has not diminished;
- New members continue to join and visitors are being assimilated;
- All county codes have been met and required variances have been obtained;
- Most of what you see has already been paid for—our financing was approved at a very low rate, but actual borrowing did not begin until April;
- Furniture will begin arriving, and pews are ordered, with the pews scheduled for installation in October;
- Total receipts for the building program approach \$6 million dollars, which means that the more received on this, the lower our indebtedness will be.

Now with about 6 months left to go in the project, we ask you to dig deep in order to continue your patience and to be as cooperative as possible for the summer and early fall. Before long, this phase will be completed. Let's continue working together as a family and hopefully by Christmas our entire family can gather under one roof that is a finished roof. Please keep praying for us, and ask the Lord of the harvest to raise up those who will reach out to others.

CUTTING FLOOR: Charles Spurgeon made these stirring applications on John 8:37:

I. I will begin by asking this question, — WHAT PLACE OUGHT THE WORD OF GOD TO HAVE IN MEN'S HEARTS? Jesus said to these Jews, "My Word hath no place in you." What place ought the Word of God to have in our hearts?

First, it ought to have an *inside place*. Many persons will give it an outside place. "The Word of God," says one, — "yes, of course I have it in my house. The Word of God, — if you come home with me, you will find that I have a splendid copy of the Bible in my best room, well bound and capitally illustrated." Another says, "I have a Bible in almost every room of my house; I think there is one in every room, I like to see it there." Yes, that is very proper and right; but, still, the place for God's Word is not an outside place, but an inside place. It is infinitely better to have it hidden in your heart than it is to have many copies of it laid among the furniture of your house. It may be that your having the Word of God so plentifully at home may increase your damnation, rather than lead to your salvation. You had the Lamp of life, but you made a dark lantern of it; you shut in the light, and never used it for any practical purpose. My dear hearers, you who pay an outward reverence to that Word, and say that it is undoubtedly inspired, and praise and extol it; if, at the same time, believing it to be true, you do not yield yourself up to its power, may God have mercy upon you, and lead you to repent of your sin! The proper place for the Word is inside, in your heart; have you got it hidden there?

Next, it ought to have a *place of high honor*. God's Word in a man ought to be in the best part of that man; not merely in the store-room of his memory, but in the drawing-room of his enjoyments, in the parlor where it shall talk with him. If the human mind be compared to a palace, the proper place for Christ's Word is on the throne. All the writings of men put together cannot equal in value one single chapter of the Bible. Their words at best are but gold-leaf; but God's Word is bullion. Here you have pearls that are altogether priceless, such as can never be found elsewhere. If the Word of Christ dwell in you, let it dwell in you richly; let it be honored and revered, beyond all the words of men, however excellent those words may be.

Give the Word of Christ an inside place and a place of honor Next, give it a *place of trust*. Let it cover you as the hen covers her chickens with her wings. Let it surround you as the ramparts surround the city, and protect it from the invader. Give yourself up to God's truth as one trusts himself in the lifeboat, hoping to be safely landed. Have no confidence but in the Word of the Master. If you stand partly on God's Word and partly on man's word, you will have one foot on a rock and the other foot upon a quicksand, and that one foot upon the quicksand will be your ruin. "Trust ye in the Lord for ever;" for his Word is faithful, true, and steadfast. Heaven and earth shall pass away,

but his Word shall never pass away. Give then to that Word all your confidence; repose upon it; for it is infallible and unchangeable.

Further, if the Word of God be in you, give it a *place of rule*. Let it be the master of your thoughts, ruling your understanding; the master of your affections, curbing your passions, and exciting in you holy desires. Let it be the master of your words; let all sinful and even all idle words be banished from your lips; let your speech be seasoned with the salt of revelation: let the Word of the Lord be the master of your action. "Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it." If Christ forbids you to do anything, let it be abjured with all the energy of your spirit. Put the Scripture, the inspired Word, put Christ, the Incarnate Word himself, upon the throne of your whole being, and surrender yourself to him, without attempting to make any terms or conditions.

The Word of God ought also to have in *us a place of love*. "O how love I thy law," said David. God's Word is never truly known till it is loved. "I hate vain thoughts, but thy law do I love," said David; he esteemed it more than gold, yea, than much fine gold. In religion, to love is to know; I wish it were always true that to know is to love. When we love the Word, and it saturates our whole being, so that we cannot relinquish it, but take an intense delight in it, and have a fervent affection for every part of it, then it is that we put the Word of God into the place it ought to occupy; — not in the garret of the brain, but in the parlor of the heart, and there let it take up its permanent abode.

News from the Assistant Pastor

There is still time to participate in the next New Member Class / Inquirer Class. This class is designed to teach you what it means to be a member of Midway, what we believe, and the expectations upon you as a member. Attendance is required for those wishing to join Midway, but attendance at the class does not obligate you to join. The class begins June 1 and will last for approximately eight weeks. It will meet in the choir room during the Sunday School hour (9:45 a.m. to 10:45 a.m.). The choir room is located in the basement under the sanctuary.

Outreach Ministry / Visitor Follow-up: There is still time to let me know if you are interested in following up visitors to Midway. This would not be doing cold call door-to-door evangelism with folks who visited a worship service, but, rather, it would be discussing ideas on how to better enfold visitors, maybe making some phone calls, sending out handwritten letters, inviting to church activities, etc. If you are interested in being a part of an outreach team and assimilating new people into our fellowship, please see me ASAP.

Lisa and I are very thankful for the many acts of kindness and words of encouragement that have been showered upon us since we arrived here at Midway. We consider it a privilege to serve the Lord together with you all.

Finance Committee / Diaconate Report

To the congregation of Midway Presbyterian Church:

The Lord has blessed Midway richly and allowed the growth of many wonderful ministry programs directed within the church as well as our missions program directed outside our walls.

We have now undertaken an ambitious building program and are at the halfway point in paying for this project—even before we have completed it. We are so deeply grateful for your greater than expected contributions to our Building Fund. You have responded exactly as we've requested—with generosity and sacrifice. In fact, the total giving of the congregation this year is ahead of last year at this time by \$100,000!

While the building fund is well ahead of last years givings, our general fund is currently \$168,000 behind budgeted receipts for the year. It is somewhat natural that some giving will and should go to the building fund which is truly a multi-generational effort. Thus, while asking that you remember our General Fund, we want to express our Praise to the Lord and thanks to you.

As always, we remind you to share your first fruits and tithe to our local body first (Malachi 3:10-11). The first tenth is the tithe that is the Lord's any-way...he has commanded that we bring that amount to the storehouse which is the church...our offerings are to be what we give above the tithe...that is the true giving to the Lord.

Your gifts will allow us to continue our strong benevolent givings and to minimize our building indebtedness as much as possible. Special and regular gifts also will allow us to carry out an ambitious summer of ministry with our new staff members fully on board.

Please, if you will, consider a one-time gift to your church. As you give unto the Lord, we are deeply thankful and deeply dependent on him.
